

The 16 policy domains are abortion, campaign finance, civil rights, criminal justice, education, environment, gun control, health and welfare, housing and transportation, immigration, private sector labor, public sector labor, LGBT rights, marijuana, taxes, and voting. The authors added two additional domains: tobacco, and “policy activity” (a measure of how many policies a state modified in the other 17 domains).
